Dear Member,

Once again, North Arkansas Electric Cooperative continued its commitment to member service in a financially responsible manner. Our debt service covenants were sufficient to meet the requirements of our mortgage agreements. Member equity in the system was 34.7 percent at the end of the year. Members were refunded \$2,911,000 in cash to redeem patronage capital credits. The 2022 redemption brings the total capital credits refunded to members to \$45.431.000.

System statistics of interest include: average meters served, 38,259, a net increase of 337 meters; more than 5,078 miles of power lines; 1,430 average monthly kilowatt-hours used by members, up 50 kilowatt-hours from the previous year; a system neak demand of 228 670 kilowatts, recorded in the month of December; and a net plant valuation of \$255,888,512 at year's end.

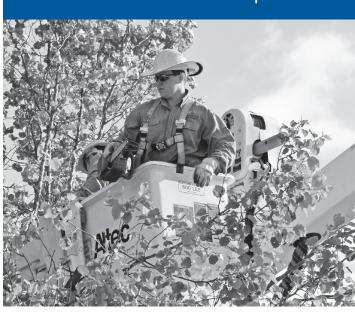
